The Guatemalan Scientific Journal of Dentistry of the School of Postgraduate Studies of the Faculty of Dentistry of the University of San Carlos of Guatemala (USAC) is an academic journal, refereed by professional peers and researchers, double-blind and external to the publishing entity, is open access and has national and international coverage.

The main objective is to publish unpublished articles related to Dentistry and its different areas of knowledge, in addition to providing a space for academic and scientific dissemination under the criteria and rigor dictated by science, technology and international publishing standards, based on the <u>COPE code of ethics</u>.

Among the articles that can be published in the journal are: original research articles, essays clinical consort type randomized trials, systematic review articles, basic clinical research (biology and technology), case reports/clinical techniques, interviews, congress summaries, tributes, an editorial, etc. (see details in: types of articles that can be published in the magazine).

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# **GUIDELINES AND GUIDELINES FOR AUTHORS AND REVIEWERS**

### INTRODUCTION

The Guatemalan Scientific Journal of Dentistry belongs to the Postgraduate School of Dentistry, USAC. Submitted manuscripts must be related to Dentistry and must be original articles (for example: scientific articles resulting from research, clinical trials, basic science related to the biological aspects of dentistry, basic science related to the techniques of dentistry, case reports or review articles related to the scientific or applied aspects of dentistry).

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Your manuscript must be an editable digital document, including text, figures and /or tables, or you can submit it in separate digital documents, as the author prefers. It must include all the required sections, the minimum ones are: title, abstract, keywords (the previous 3 must be sent in Spanish and English), introduction, materials and methods, results, discussion, conclusions and bibliography. The figures and/or tables must have a title and a legend, they must also have their respective number sequence. Figures should be submitted in the highest resolution possible. References can be submitted in any style or format, as long as it is consistent throughout the manuscript and in a single format, APA <u>7ma. Edition</u> or <u>Vancouver</u> format is strongly recommended. Either, you do not need to format the references in your manuscript, instead, the typographer will take care of this. Supporting information must be submitted on separate digital documents.

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-Conclusions, here the results that answer the research questions are explicitly shown and the fulfillment or not of the objectives is highlighted.

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These should describe experimental observations that are significant, original, and provide sufficient details so that the observations can be evaluated critically and, if necessary, repeat. Original items must meet the highest international standards in the field or professional area.

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Must strictly adhere to the Consolidated Standards of Trial Reporting (CONSORT) minimum guidelines for publication of randomized clinical trials (<u>http://www.consort-statement.org</u>).

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Prospective or retrospective studies of patients or patient registries, randomized controlled trials, cohort studies, case-control studies, cross-sectional studies, case series, biopsy research excluding the use of human teeth for technique studies.

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
